

A timeless heritage

The herringbone pattern is one of the oldest and most enduring patterns in history, whose origins go back thousands upon thousands of years. This timeless design has been used in various cultures and architectural styles and has left a lasting impact on the world of design and construction.

Ancient origins

The herringbone pattern has its roots in ancient Egypt and Mesopotamia, where it was first used for woven textiles and jewellery. The name of the pattern is derived from the skeleton of a herring fish with its distinctive V-shaped bones. The ancient Egyptians adopted the herringbone pattern for their masonry and incorporated it into their architectural structures.

Roman influence






